## **KEYNOTE SPEAKER**

**Stephen Wall, MD, MSc, MAEd** Tenured Associate Professor in the Departments of Emergency Medicine and Population Health at the NYU School of Medicine and Bellevue Hospital Center

Dr. Wall received his MD and Masters in Education, Communications and Technology from NYU and Masters of Health Services Outcomes Research from the UCLA School of Public Health. He is a health behavioral researcher having broad expertise in community based participatory research, heath program evaluation, and in digital media design for learning.

His research focus is on injury prevention for vulnerable roadway users including pedestrians and bicyclists who navigate through inner city traffic and improving organ donation registration among communities least likely to register despite having proportionally among the greatest need for transplants. He served as a methodologist for collaborative New York State Funded traffic injury surveillance grants and as a site Principal Investigator for Identifying Road Hazards for Bicyclists, a study funded by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety. Dr. Wall will present recent findings about how NYC infrastructure and behaviors of roadway users impact risk of cyclist crashes and falls resulting in emergency department visits.
