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

 - Pediatric Emergency Department (if applicable)
 - SICU (PICU -if applicable)
 - PACU (Adult and Pedi)
 - Any general unit that cares for trauma patients

Information- MD Providers

- Maintain current information
 - ATLS (trauma surgeons, emergency medicine, new physicians)
 - Residency Training
 - Board Certification (or eligible, or need for alternate pathway)
- If ALTERNATE PATHWAY
 - Identify in advance
 - FACS if not eligible (process takes up to a yr)





Alternate Pathway-Level I & II Trauma Centers

- Non-Board Certified or Eligible Physicians
 - Trauma Surgeons (6-2) (pg 37)
 - Emergency Physicians (7-20) (pg 42)
 - Neurosurgeons (8-9) (pg 46)
 - Orthopedic Surgeons (9-14) (pg 52)
- On-site evaluation of the MDs care, by a member of the same specialty
- Eight criteria- must be met





Alternate Pathway-Level I Trauma Centers

- 1. Has provided exceptional care of trauma pt
- 2. Has numerous <u>trauma</u> publications & presentations
- 3. Has published excellent **trauma** related research
- 4. Is documented to provide *excellent* teaching (requires on site evaluation by MD from same specialty)





MD Education

 The American College of Surgeons requires that physician members who care for trauma patients complete 48 hours of <u>trauma-related</u> CMEs every three years =16 trauma related CMEs annually.

• Actual certificates are required for adequate documentation.





MD Education

 All physicians that care for trauma patients MUST have successfully completed an ATLS course at least once.

 In addition, Emergency Medicine physicians who are <u>not</u> board certified in Emergency Medicine are required to be <u>current</u> in ATLS.





MD Requirements

 Physicians who are designated as the trauma liaison representatives for their respective department are required to maintain current ATLS status. (neurosurgeons, orthopedics, Emergency Medicine)

&

• Complete 48 hours of **EXTERNAL trauma-related** CMEs every three years =16 external trauma related CMEs annually.

Internal Educational Process

- Trauma surgeons, Neurosurgeons, Orthopedists, emergency physicians
- If PEDS TC- pediatric surgeons & Pedi Intensivists (also)
- <u>Educational topics</u> identified in the <u>PI process</u> (ideally)
- Presented by TMD or liaison: electronic with documentation
- At least **Quarterly** department or other meetings
- <u>Document meetings</u>- attendance and the content
- Binder with documentation- available at site visit***





Trauma Registry

- Ongoing monitoring in Registry-for PRQ and/or for site visit
 - Response times for highest level of activation
 - Locations of admit; ISS; Deaths; Admit service
 - Neurosurgery-craniotomies<24 hours
 - Orthopedics- cases <24 hours; Complex pelvic fx
 - Non-surgical admission (categories-see FAQ)review all concurrently for appropriateness
 - Pediatric cases (<15 years)
 - Organ donation rate





Outreach/Education

- To improve regional outcomes from major trauma by the dissemination of knowledge and expertise regarding the care of injured pt
- To participate with regional agencies, organizations, and providers in improving the regional trauma care system
- To facilitate access to trauma center resources (education&/or prevention programs, performance improvement, consultation, and referrals)
- To support educational programs of regional facilities and trauma health care personnel





Injury Prevention Activities

Epidemiology research

- Monitor progress such as: how many car seat, distributed,
 % of smoke detectors in homes, and seatbelts and/or motorcycle or bike helmets
- Evaluate effectiveness of programs using parameters such as: fatalities, hospitalization rates, and severity of injuries

Surveillance

- Expanded data on prevention include BA levels, toxic agent presence, use of restraint systems, and helmet utilization
- Capability of doing special data collection projectsmonitoring helmets use in the community





Injury Prevention Activities

- Prevention
 - Designated spokesperson for injury control
 - Provide a primary IPC course for surgical residents and other HCP
- Develop policies & practices that create a culture of health promotion and safety within the institution
 - Can vary from coordinated bike helmet use campaigns to developing PSA for broadcast, to IP fairs, to car seat loaner programs
 - Links to department of health and community health
